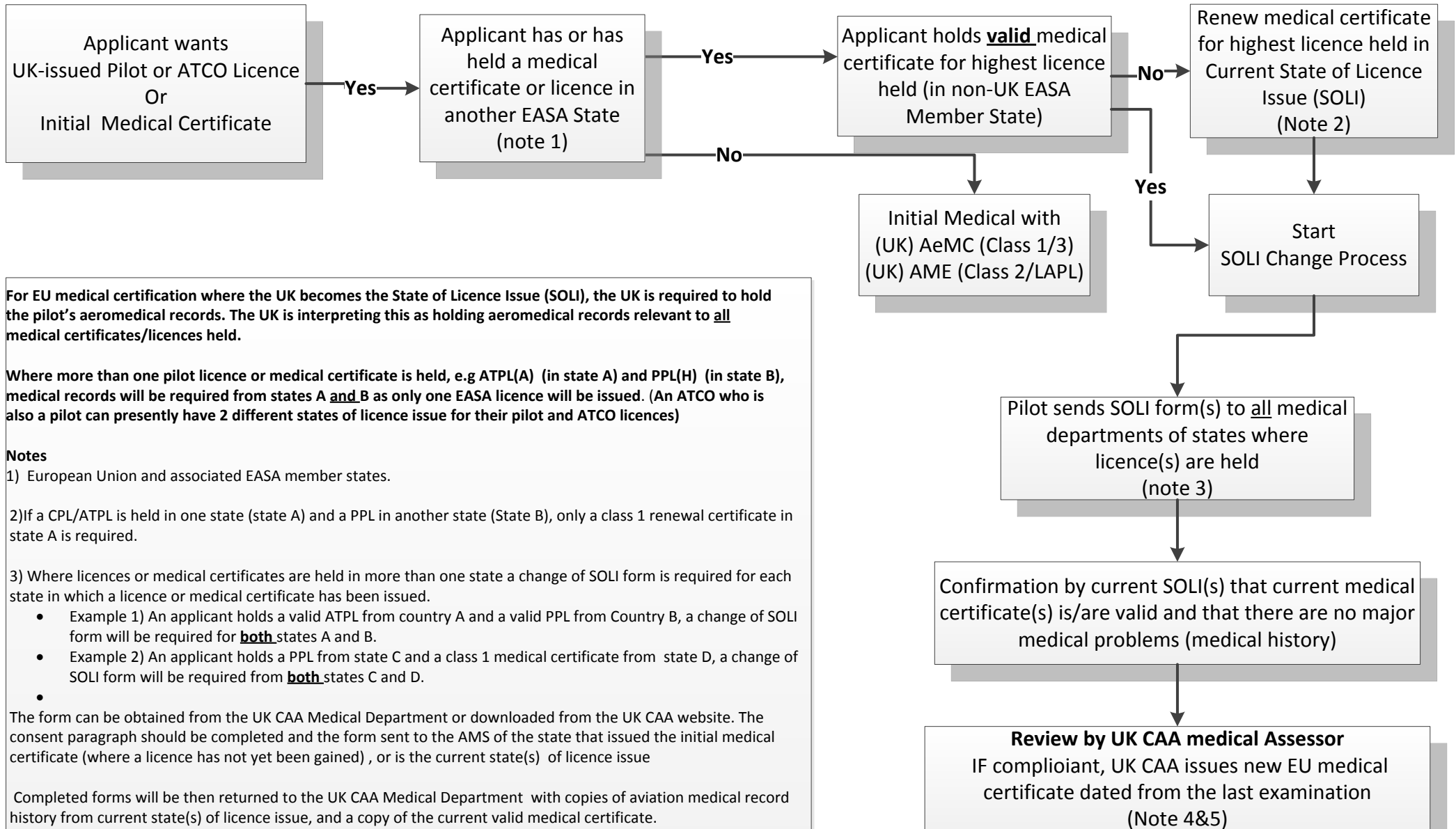


# Process for Pilots and ATCOs who require a UK-issued EU Licence and/or medical certificate



For EU medical certification where the UK becomes the State of Licence Issue (SOLI), the UK is required to hold the pilot's aeromedical records. The UK is interpreting this as holding aeromedical records relevant to all medical certificates/licences held.

Where more than one pilot licence or medical certificate is held, e.g ATPL(A) (in state A) and PPL(H) (in state B), medical records will be required from states A and B as only one EASA licence will be issued. (An ATCO who is also a pilot can presently have 2 different states of licence issue for their pilot and ATCO licences)

**Notes**

- 1) European Union and associated EASA member states.
- 2) If a CPL/ATPL is held in one state (state A) and a PPL in another state (State B), only a class 1 renewal certificate in state A is required.
- 3) Where licences or medical certificates are held in more than one state a change of SOLI form is required for each state in which a licence or medical certificate has been issued.
  - Example 1) An applicant holds a valid ATPL from country A and a valid PPL from Country B, a change of SOLI form will be required for **both** states A and B.
  - Example 2) An applicant holds a PPL from state C and a class 1 medical certificate from state D, a change of SOLI form will be required from **both** states C and D.

The form can be obtained from the UK CAA Medical Department or downloaded from the UK CAA website. The consent paragraph should be completed and the form sent to the AMS of the state that issued the initial medical certificate (where a licence has not yet been gained), or is the current state(s) of licence issue

Completed forms will be then returned to the UK CAA Medical Department with copies of aviation medical record history from current state(s) of licence issue, and a copy of the current valid medical certificate.

- 4) The applicant shall pay the UK CAA the requisite fee.
- 5) If no medical records certified by the AMS of the current SOLI state are available to support a transfer, the UK CAA Medical Department is unlikely to accept a transfer.
