

Management of ATCO Decrease in Medical Fitness

COMMISSION REGULATION (EU) No. 805/2011 - ATCO LICENSING

Notes

1) Licence holders shall not exercise the privileges of their licence at any time when they are aware of any decrease in their medical fitness which might render them unable to safely exercise the privileges of their licence.

See reverse of Medical Certificate.

Licence holders shall, without undue delay, seek fitness advice from an AME or the CAA when they:

- have undergone a surgical procedure or invasive procedure
- have commenced the regular use of any medication
- have suffered any significant personal injury involving incapacity to function
- are, or have reason to believe, they are pregnant
- have been admitted to a hospital or medical clinic

2) Licence holders shall notify the relevant ANSP that they are becoming aware of any decrease in their fitness or are under the influence of any psychoactive substance or medicine which might render them unable to safely exercise the privileges of their licence

ANSPs shall establish procedures (approved by the CAA) to manage the operational impact of cases of reduced fitness and inform the CAA when a licence holder has been assessed as medically unfit. ANSPs may choose to use the ATCO's usual AME, or a company AME as part of Occupational Health arrangements. A clinical consultation may be needed.

3) Aeromedical advice and assessments can only be provided by an AME or the CAA Medical Department.

Unfit assessments must be notified to the CAA
