INTRODUCTION OF THE CAA'S 'EASA – AIR OPERATIONS' WEBPAGE

1 Introduction

- 1.1 This FODCOM should be read in conjunction with [FODCOM 19/2008](#) which highlighted the extension to the European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) Basic Regulation and explained EASA's plans for further rulemaking.
- 1.2 The purpose of this FODCOM is to bring to the attention of all stakeholders the introduction of the CAA's EASA – Air Operations webpage.

2 Issue

- 2.1 In preparation for the introduction of Implementing Rules for air operations in April 2012, the CAA has introduced a webpage to inform all stakeholders of the developments. The initial webpage entries link the reader to EASA's own website for recent Notices of Proposed Amendment, which affect aspects of air operations. Information from the European Commission and EASA relating to how the processes are developing and outstanding issues following the introduction of EU-OPS are also included.
- 2.2 As further topics arise which are considered to educate and inform, they will be placed on the webpage. The [webpage](#) can be found on the CAA website via Safety Regulation > EASA.
