Title:	Engine Exhaust Valves: Removal from Service

Reason:	 Rolls-Royce has recently identified production non-conformances in certain batches of sodium-filled exhaust valves manufactured within specific dates. These non-conformances have been shown to lead to the valve cracking. The observed cracking could lead to valve failure and engine loss of power. This could result in a forced landing with consequent damage to the aeroplane and injury to occupants. This MPD has been raised to address this potential unsafe condition.

contd.	Within three calendar months of the effective date of this MPD:				
	1. From engine records or by detailed inspection, determine the source and manufacture date of the exhaust valves fitted to the engine.				
	2. Remove from service all exhaust valves from the non-conforming batches detailed in Table 1 and replace with a new or serviceable part.				
	3. Remove from service all exhaust valves where the source and date of manufacture cannot be determined and replace with a new or serviceable part.				
	FOR SPARE PARTS STOCK				
	From the effective date of this MPD:				
	1. From stores inventory and by detailed inspection, determine the source and manufacture date of all spare parts stock. Remove from service and quarantine any exhaust valve detailed in Table 1 or any, where the source and date of manufacture cannot be determined.				
	 Do not install, on any engine, any exhaust valves from the non- conforming batches detailed in Table 1.
