Please note that the presence of 2 criteria in the most severe category determines the category to be used for certificatory assessment.

Complex skull fracture. Any operative intervention. Early (≤ 7 days) seizure. 	Class 1 & 3 Unfit 2 years after full recovery without symptoms. Then Class 1 OML long-term, Class 3 unrestricted. Class 2 Unfit for 1 year after full recovery without symptoms or demonstration of stable, non-disabling symptoms. Then OSL for 1 year. LAPL Unfit for 6 months after full recovery without symptoms or demonstration of stable, non-disabling symptoms. Then OSL/OPL for 6 months. Early (≤ 7 days) and /or late (>7 days) seizures. 	Class 1, 2 & 3 Unfit long-term. LAPL Unfit 1 year after full recovery without symptoms or demonstration of stable, non-disabling symptoms. Then OSL/OPL long-term.	LAPL Medical report from attending specialist including investigations. CT/MRI mandatory before recertification. Satisfactory medical flight test. And AME clinical assessment.

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
