ALAN ELLIOTT	<ul> <li>Alan Elliott was the pilot of a Cessna 182 aeroplane which flew low over Goodison Park football stadium towing a banner.</li> <li>Mr Elliott was convicted after trial of one offence of flying over a congested area at a height less than 1,000 feet above the highest obstacle within a radius of 600 metres.</li> </ul>	04/04/2017	Liverpool Magistrates' Court	Fine £2,000
ANDREW HART	Andrew Hart held a Private Pilot's Licence. His SEP rating expired in October 2015 and his Medical Certificate expired in October 2015. On 12 December 2016, he was the pilot of a Piper PA28 aircraft on a flight which landed at Shobden aerodrome. Mr Hart pleaded guilty to flying without a valid licence.	06/07/2017	Worcester Magistrates' Court	Fine £600
ROBERT BAWN	Robert Bawn was the pilot of a microlight aircraft which flew twice within Class D controlled airspace, the Manchester Control Zone, on 20 January 2017. Aircraft arrivals were suspended on both occasions; delays were caused to 15 inbound passenger aircraft. Mr Bawn pleaded guilty to flying within Class D controlled airspace without air traffic control clearance.	20/07/2017	Manchester Magistrates' Court	Fine £1,675



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ANTHONY HOPE	Anthony Hope was the pilot of a microlight aircraft which flew within temporarily restricted airspace in place for a Red Arrows display at Duxford. The Red Arrows stopped their display because there was a serious risk of collision. Mr Hope pleaded guilty to flying within the RA(T).	30/01/2018	Luton Magistrates' Court	Fine £1,250
DAVID HARBOTTLE	<ul> <li>David Harbottle was the pilot of a Piper PA-E23 <ul> <li>aeroplane. A NOTAM had been issued stating that there</li> <li>was no Approach or Radar service at Coventry and the</li> <li>Tower service was available on 118.175; this information</li> <li>was also available on the Coventry ATIS.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Mr Harbottle entered the ATZ and landed at Coventry</li> <li>without permission; he was using the wrong radio</li> <li>frequency.</li> <li>Mr Harbottle was convicted after trial of flying within the</li> <li>ATZ without permission and not maintaining watch on the appropriate radio frequency.</li> </ul>	28/03/2018	Coventry Magistrates' Court	Fine £3,600
