Trigger Definition

Introduction - Overall Business Case

Completion of the T3 Integrated Baggage programme of works.

Trigger Objective

In order to achieve the completion of T3 Integrated Baggage programme of works, the project will complete the following:

- Integrated baggage system which provides integrated make-up facilities for direct and transfer out-bound baggage.
- Automated baggage build capability using 2 robots (Level 20)
- Semi-automated baggage build capability using 3 powered handling aids (Level 20)
- Manual handling aids to be fitted to build laterals (where practicable) (Level 00)

Achievement Criteria

Construction complete of the T3 Integrated Baggage Cut-ins, the New Baggage Building and the OOG Facility in the existing baggage hall, with PA3 handover to the operation.

The Trigger date detailed above will include all commissioning and testing, such that it is delivered fit for operational use on or before the trigger date. Achievement will only be accepted by the airline community after such commissioning and testing.

Agreed Parameters

- 1. Inter and Intra terminal Airline moves in accordance with current schedule (Appendix 2)
- 2. Based on current agreed planned occupancy of T3 (Appendix 3)
- 3. Airlines will, where required, need to vacate from their check-in desks in order to facilitate asset replacement, i.e. where baggage belt replacement is required.



Payment of Rebate

The trigger calculation has been based on the CAA's settlement price control licence condition (Jan 14).

The trigger value reflects Heathrow's predicted full Q6 spend for the project which includes £35m that has been removed in the CAA Settlement. This will be reviewed by the CAA in early 2016 and the output of the review could affect the trigger value.

CAA post project review – ref paragraph C89, p236 of CAA document "CAP 1138 Economic regulation at Heathrow from April 14: notice of the proposed Licence"

The monthly rebate for late delivery of the triggered project is as detailed above. The payment of the rebate will be for complete calendar months following the target date and will continue until the end of the month following the fulfilment of the triggered project as specified above.

Airline Community Position

The Airline Community is fully committed to the completion of the T3IB project without delay and its successful integration with the operation. The Airline Community supports the need for a T3IB trigger and has worked closely with Heathrow to develop the trigger definition for the final stage of the T3IB project. The signing of the T3IB trigger by the Airline Community does not imply acceptance of the capital funding.
