ANDREW KANE	Andrew Kane was the pilot of a Gazelle helicopter which flew through temporarily restricted airspace in the vicinity of Old Warden aerodrome in place for a Red Arrows display. Mr Kane flew his helicopter through the RQA(T) during the Red Arrows' display, causing the display to be stopped because of the proximity of his aircraft to the Red Arrows. Mr Kane pleaded guilty to (1) failing to take all reasonable steps to satisfy himself that the flight could safely be made and (2) flying within restricted airspace.	09/08/2016	Luton Magistrates' Court	Fine £2,510

AMAZON.CO.UK.LTD	Amazon was despatching items such as lithium ion batteries for carriage by air. The items were dangerous goods when carried by air and Amazon had been warned by Royal Mail and the CAA that this was the case. JONATHAN TOWNSEND	aircraft. Jonathan Townsend was diagnosed with depression and prescribed medication. WESLEY TIERNEY	Wesley Tierney had a military glider pilot qualification. He claimed to have a Private Pilot's Licence and to have flown a number of hours in powered aircraft. On numerous occasions between 2012 and 2016, he flew powered aircraft and took passengers with him. He did not have a Licence or the claimed flying experience. Mr Tierney pleaded guilty to 5 charges: three charges of flying without a licence, one charge of knowingly making a false entry in an aircraft log book and one charge of purporting to issue a certificate.	03/03/2017	Cambridge Crown Court	8 months imprisonment suspended for 14 months; 140 hours unpaid work.
SIMON DUBOCK	Simon Dubock was the pilot of a Piper PA28 aeroplane. He took-off from Carlisle and flew southwards along the coast. He flew within three areas of Class A controlled airspace without clearance, causing Liverpool air traffic to restrict departures. Mr Dubock then turned westerly towards Anglesey and flew within restricted airspace around Wylfa nuclear power station. He flew around the coast of Anglesey, the north coast of Wales and then flew within Class D controlled airspace without air traffic control clearance. Mr Dubock was convicted after trial of four offences of flying within controlled airspace without clearance and one offence of flying within restricted airspace.	06/03/2017	Manchester Magistrates' Court	Fine £2,500
