



Before you begin

UK regulations require occurrences to be reported to the CAA within 72 hours of the occurrence becoming known to the reporter.

Therefore, it is important to use this form to report the occurrence, even if you don't have all the information immediately available. Please ensure you complete the sections marked as "required" with an asterisk (*). Typically, you can find the necessary information to complete these sections in the associated transport documents attached with the consignment of concern.

Occurrence reporting helps improve aviation safety by ensuring that relevant safety information is reported, collected, stored, protected exchanged, disseminated and analysed. It is not to attribute blame or liability but supports continued learning to make flying safer.

You will need the following information to complete this form:

- Any media and documents related to the consignment that you possess when filling out this form. You can send additional
 documents and media later if required.
- Any pertinent information about the shipper or other entities involved in the handling of this consignment that you believe are necessary.
- · A personal account from the individual who first witnessed the occurrence.
