Thank you for your request of 02 May 2025, for the release of information held by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA). For reference your original enquiry was as follows:

*I request a written confirmation from the Civil Aviation Authority that provides a comprehensive list of all drone testing sites (Unmanned Aircraft Systems or UAS testing areas) currently and historically recognised, authorised, or approved within the United Kingdom.*

*Please ensure the response includes the following information for each site:*

1. *Official name or designation of the site*
2. *Precise location (coordinates or descriptive address)*
3. *Date of approval and operational duration (where available)*
4. *Authorised testing activities (e.g. BVLOS operations, autonomous flight trials, etc.)*
5. *Names of organisations or entities operating or managing the site*

Your request has been considered in line with the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). I can confirm that following a review of held information it has been determined that the CAA holds no information within scope of the above request.

The CAA is developing a process to enable test site recognition. Information with respect to this process was recently published within the CAA's Test & Evaluation Annual Report, (published in April 2025);

The details of the test site recognition process will be published and publicly available once the work has been completed.

## CAA INTERNAL REVIEW & COMPLAINTS PROCEDURE

- The original case to which the appeal or complaint relates is identified and the case file is made available;
- The appeal or complaint is allocated to an Appeal Manager, the appeal is acknowledged and the details of the Appeal Manager are provided to the applicant;
- The Appeal Manager reviews the case to understand the nature of the appeal or complaint, reviews the actions and decisions taken in connection with the original case and takes account of any new information that may have been received. This will typically require contact with those persons involved in the original case and consultation with the CAA Legal Department;
- The Appeal Manager concludes the review and, after consultation with those involved with the case, and with the CAA Legal Department, agrees on the course of action to be taken;
- The Appeal Manager prepares the necessary response and collates any information to be provided to the applicant;

- The response and any necessary information is sent to the applicant, together with information about further rights of appeal to the Information Commissioners Office, including full contact details.
